Let the light shine in the darkness
Statement of Religious Leaders Regarding Russian Attacks on the Ukrainian Power
Grid "For you Lord, give light to my lamp, my
God brightens my darkness." [Psalm 18, 29]
On the night of March 22, Russia launched its largest attack against Ukraine's energy system, deploying over 60 kamikaze drones and almost 90 missiles. Dozens of power facilities were damaged, including thermal and hydroelectric power stations, high-voltage networks, and regional energy grids.

Millions of civilians across the Vinnytsia, Ivano-Frankivsk, Lviv, Khmelnytskyi, Zaporizhzhia, Sumy, Odesa, Dnipropetrovsk, Donetsk, and Kharkiv regions now face massive power outages and crippling energy shortages, endangering the most vulnerable and threatening all life-support systems. Kharkiv, a city of 1.5 million inhabitants, is particularly stricken as Russian attacks targeted its main energy facilities, leaving residents without electricity, heat, and hot water on a night when temperatures will plummet below freezing. We, leaders of religious organizations in the United States, condemn these Russian attacks against civilians and civilian in-

frastructure as war crimes. We beseech the religious leaders of Russia, especially Patriarch Kirill of the Russian Orthodox Church, to stop supporting the Russian invasion of Ukraine and to urge President Putin to halt terror attacks aimed at innocent civilians. We likewise urge our government and civic authorities to utilize all available just means to protect Ukraine and its people from this brutal aggression.

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." [John 1:5]

#### Заява Владик щодо Російських атак на енергомережу України

Бо Ти, Господи, запали світло світильника мого, Бог мій освітлює темряву мою". (Псалом 18:29).

У ніч на 22 березня Росія здійснила найбільшу атаку на енергетичну систему України, застосувавши понад 60 безпілотників-камікадзе та майже 90 ракет. Було пошкоджено десятки енергетичних об'єктів, включаючи теплові та гідроелектростанції, високовольтні мережі та регіональні енергомережі. Мільйони цивільних осіб у Вінницькій, Івано-Франківській, Львівській, Хмельницькій, Запорізькій, Сумській, Одеській, Дніпропетровській, Донецькій та Харківській областях стикаються з масовими відключеннями електроенергії та катастрофічним дефіцитом енергоносіїв, що ставить під загрозу найбільш вразливі верстви населення та загрожує всім системам життєзабезпечення. Харків, місто з 1,5 мільйонами мешканців, особливо постраждав від російських атак на основні енергетичні об'єкти, залишивши мешканців без електрики, тепла та гарячої води вночі, коли температура повітря впаде нижче нуля. Ми, лідери релігійних організацій США, засуджуємо ці російські атаки проти цивільного населення та цивільної інфраструктури як воєнні злочини. Ми просимо релігійних лідерів Росії, особливо Патріарха Російської Православної Церкви Кирила, припинити підтримку російського вторгнення в Україну і закликати Президента Путіна припинити терористичні атаки, спрямовані проти невинних цивільних осіб. Ми також закликаємо наш уряд і громадянське суспільство використати всі доступні справедливі засоби для захисту України та її народу від цієї жорстокої агресії. "Світло світить у темряві, і темрява не перемогла його". (Івана 1:5). Ми тверді у своїй рішучості: не дозволити темряві взяти гору нал світлом.


