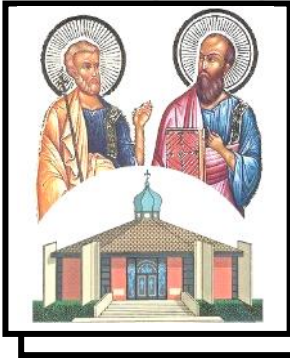

Letter from Mother to Daughter

In the previous bulletin this story was not printed in its complete form. Sincere apologies. Here is the full story.

If when we talk, I repeat the same thing a thousand times, don't interrupt to say: "You said the same thing a minute ago"... Just listen, please. This Year's Church School Camp is expanding! The dates in August are being finalized.

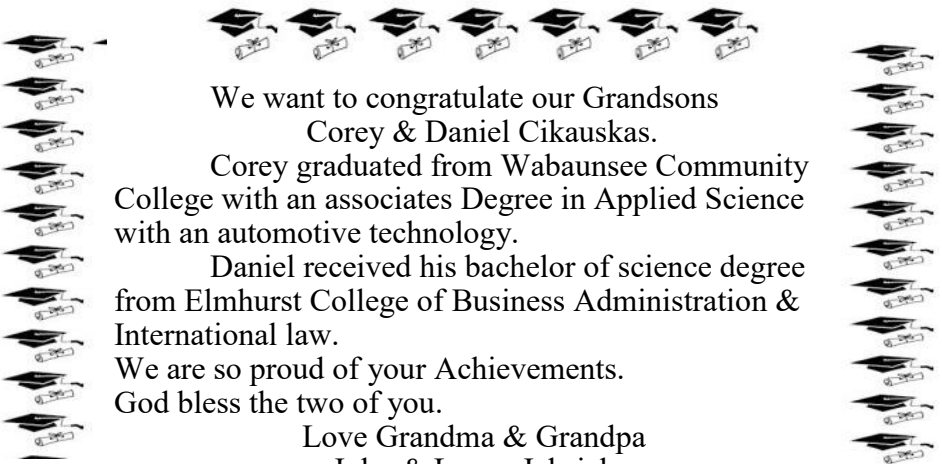

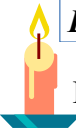
