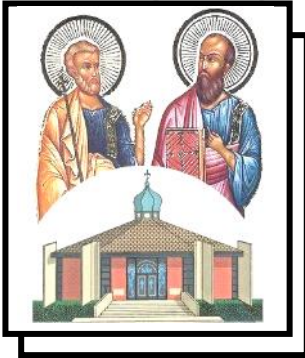

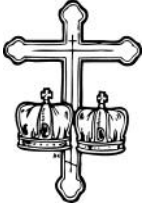
Apology And Thank you.
