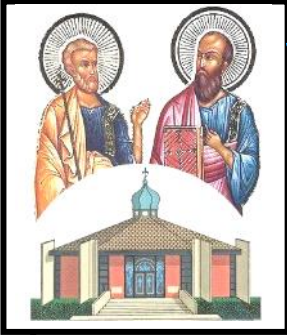

Sunday School Teacher's corner

Recap of the lesson from Sunday October 14

The children learned about the original 12 Apostles—not only their names but a bit about their backgrounds as well. We used painting of The Last Supper as a focal point in identifying who they are. When viewed from the left...



1. Bartholomew (also known as Nathaniel). Was introduced to Jesus by Philip.
 2. James the Lessor called the Lessor so as not to be confused with the other James; was the younger one.
 3. Andrew the founder and the first bishop of the Church of Byzantium. He is the brother of Simon Peter. He was the first to hear about Jesus.
 4. Judas Iscariot—was the treasurer of the group--betrayed Jesus.
 5. Peter (also known as Simon Peter, The Rock), brother of Andrew. The brothers, who were fishermen, were the first to be called by Jesus to follow him. Peter became the first Catholic Pope. He was crucified upside down because he felt he wasn't worthy be crucified the same way as Jesus was. He had a wife who journeyed with him on his travels.
 6. John, son of Zebedee, brother of James the Greater. Was the youngest of the Apostles. When Jesus was dying on the cross, Jesus asked John to look after his mother, Mary. He wrote five books in the New Testament, the Gospel of Saint John, three epistles and the Book of Revelation. The only one to die a natural death.
 7. Thomas—also known as Doubting Thomas, was a twin; established the church in India.
 8. James the Greater, the older brother of John. They were fishermen who worked together in their father's fishing business before following Jesus. James was the first to be martyred.
 9. Philip—was a friend of John the Baptist and established the church in Africa.
 10. Matthew—a Publican (a Hebrew tax collector for the Roman government). Wrote the Gospel of St. Matthew.
 11. Judas Thaddeus wrote the Epistle of St. Jude.
 12. Simon the Zealot A Zealot was a member of a Jewish revolutionary group that was against the Roman government. During the first century the Publicans and Zealots were bitter political rivals.

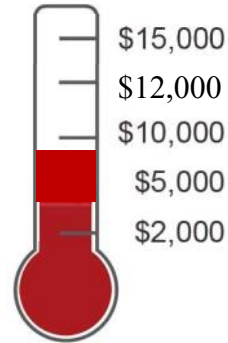
