

On Love and Unity

I want you to know this, that Jesus Christ our Lord is Himself the true Mind of the Father. By Him all the fullness of every rational nature is made in the image of His image, and He Himself is the head of all creation, and

of His body the Church (Col. 1:15-18). Therefore we are all members one of another, and the body of Christ, and the head cannot say to the feet, 'I have no need of you'; and if one member suffers, the whole body is moved and suffers with it (Eph. 4:25). But if a member is estranged from the body, and has no communication with the head, but is delighted by the passions of its own body, this means that its wound is incurable, and it has forgotten its beginning and its end. And therefore the Father of creatures, moved with compassion towards this our wound, which could not be healed by any of the creatures, but only by the goodness of the Father, sent forth to us

His Only-begotten, who because of our bondage took upon Himself the form of a bondservant, and gave Himself up for our sins; for our iniquities humbled Him, and by His wound we are all healed; and He gathered us out of all regions, till He should make resurrection of our hearts from the earth, and teach us that we are all of one substance, and members one of another. Therefore we ought greatly to love one another. For he who loves his neighbor, loves God: and he who loves God, loves his own soul.

On Hospitality



Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unawares. (Heb. 13:2)

Accepting the task of hospitality, the patriarch [Abraham] used to sit at the

entrance to his tent (cf. Gen. 18:1), inviting all who passed by, and his table was laden for all comers including the impious and barbarians, without distinction. Hence he was found worthy of that wonderful banquet when he received angels and the Master of all as guests. We too, then, should actively and eagerly cultivate hospitality, so that we may receive not only angels, but also God Himself. "For inasmuch," says the Lord, "as you have done it to one of the least of these My brethren, you have done it unto Me" (Matt. 25:40). It is good to be generous to all, especially to those who cannot repay you.

...Even if you have only bread or water, with these you can still meet the dues of hospitality. Even if you do not have these, but simply make the stranger welcome and offer him a word of encouragement, you will not be failing in hospitality. Think of the widow mentioned in the Gospel by our Lord: with two mites she surpassed the generous gifts of the wealthy.

SUNDAY SCHOOL RECAP FOR FEB. 11TH

We are continuing our lessons on Saints ... In the Orthodox Church the only "true" Saint is God Himself.



Sainthood is a gift (charisma) given to people by God, through the Holy Spirit. It not a theory, but and experience. Through the Grace of God, many Saints perform miracles while alive.

According to the Orthodox Faith, the goal of people is to imitate God and live the life of sanctification. St. Maximos the Confessor writes that the "Saints are men and women who have reached theosis; they have avoided sin, and tried to live according to created nature, thus achieving total unity with God through the Holy Spirit." They fought "good fight for the faith" (1 Tim. 6:12 and 2 Tim. 4:7), and applied the scriptural virtues of "justice, piety, fidelity, love, fortitude, and gentleness" (1 Tim. 6:11) in their lives.

So, the Orthodox Church honors Saints as "Friends of God". In their worldly life, and through daily repentance, constant spiritual struggle against their weaknesses, genuine piety, and absolute obedience to His Divine Commandments, the Saints pleased God Who sanctified them both in body and soul. After their passing into eternal life, they have been accepted in God's bosom and have been granted the special gift to pray and intercede for those remaining in the world. Thus, the Saints are the ultimate role models of an Orthodox Christian.


