These are the perfect words to describe the events of the last weekend. To be honest with you the week be-



fore the last weekend was not an easy one. We all knew very well that we were getting closer to the second, second year anniversary of the war in Ukraine. It was hard to believe that the war has been raging for two years now in Ukraine.

However, we do not lose hope and continue to pray for peace in our ancestral homeland Ukraine.

This wasn't different on Saturday as we had a filled church for special Moleben for Ukraine at one o'clock in the afternoon. To hear the voices of little children reciting so genuinely the prayer of "Our Father" was indeed spiritually overwhelming. You didn't know weather or smile or to cry.

On Saturday afternoon, the church hall and the kitchen were as busy as it could ever get. A special meal was being prepared for Sunday. On Sunday morning parishioners and visitors one after another were coming into the temple accompanied by chime of church bells. The choir sounded magnificent. The team of the altar servers did a fabulous job of assisting the priest at the service. Children once again led the whole congregation in the prayer of "Our Father" in both languages. The line to receive the Holy Communion seemed endless. At the end of the service, a beautiful icon of the mother of God of perpetual help curved out of wood was blessed. This icon was gifted to the Church by Hrechka family, who came to the USA escaping the war.

The Church hall was filled to the brim. More tables were added to accommodate all of the people. The food smelled delicious. We prayed together to bless the food and feasted upon superb meal. The documentary movie about the war in Ukraine called "Freedom on fire" was streamed. It was hard to see the images of destroyed buildings and suffering people. However, it's the reality of Ukraine today. Its' been the reality of Ukraine for the last 731 days. This horror continues on. The innocent people continue to suffer the unbelievable atrocity of 21st century.

It's our hope that this war will be over soon. We continue to pray and continue to believe that the truth will prevail and the war will end and our ancestral home Ukraine will be free once again. Thanks to the generosity of people who have attended we have raised \$4158.00 for the Ukrainian people.

SUNDAY SCHOOL RECAP FOR FEB. 25TH

We continued our "Saints" theme by reviewing the 'Categories of Saints' and what items they wear, hold or how their hands are presented.

PROPHETS: wear a yellow ribbon on their shoulder; they usually dress according to their social status while they were living on earth. (David & Solomon dressed like kings) FATHERS/HIERARCHS: Clergy vestments, often decorated with a pattern of Crosses; they hold a Gospel book, because they followed and preached the Word of God through the Gospels; their right hand is often depicted in a gesture of blessing. MONASTICS: wear a dark monastic habit which is usually hooded; they may hold a cross, a scroll (opened or closed) because they preached through the way they lived; if they wrote Scriptural texts the scroll is open.

Our handouts were 'match the Saints' with their objects they are associated with and a maze with the same theme.

Ms. Debbie presented Saint Philothei, whose name means "friend of God". She was born in 1522 and died in 1589. She was forced into marriage at age 14 and was mistreated by her husband. When he died she went back home and refused to marry again. Her family was wealthy so after her parents died she used her wealth to help girls and young women escape from oppression. Many were forced to be slaves or marry Turkish soldiers. She took up a monastic life and established a women's monastery, hospices, homes for the elderly and schools for girls and boys in Athens. St. Philothei has been called a "protector of women's rights". In October of 1588 four Ottoman mercenaries broke into the monastery at Patisia and beat her severely. She remained bedridden and died of her injuries February 1589 at age 66.




